Educational Program Selection

Day One - Monday, April 2, 2012 (Select only one)

A) Fire and Smoke Protection in the IBC- A Guide to Code Compliance- David Dodge CDT McKeon Door Co.

This all day course will cover a full range of topics as they relate to fire protection systems to include occupancy classifications, opening protective guidelines for fire walls, working with the three part means of egress system, and complying with separation requirements as they relate to mixed occupancies, vertical openings, atriums, corridors, elevators and exit access. (6 Hours)

B) Construction in the Flood Plain- Nick Agnoli FEMA PE CFM

This conference presentation will cover the basics of determining the flood zone associated with a commercial, industrial or residential property, the impacts of the zone on permitted uses and construction methods, and methods of mitigating the impacts on a structure that has already been constructed in the zone. Additional topics will include modernization of the FEMA FIRMS, accessing the most current map and flood study information, and assisting property owners when the determination may be inaccurate. It will also include a brief overview of the CRS. (5 Hours)

C) ADA Update- Dominic Marinelli, United Spinal

An all day seminar on the updated accessibility requirements called for in the 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design, the 2010 NY State Building Code (ANSI 117.1-2003) and the Fair Housing Accessibility Guidelines. The seminar will cover both Commercial and Residential. (6 Hours)

Day Two - Tuesday, April 3, 2012 (Select only one)

A) Inspection Testing and Maintenance of Sprinkler Systems for the AHJ - National Sprinkler Assoc.

This intense all day seminar will focus on the two primary questions that all AHJ's are concerned with when it comes to water-based fire protection systems; "Will the system work?" and "How do I know?" Through discussion of the administrative Chapters (1-4) and the corrective Chapters (14-15) of NFPA 25 and activities centering on system documentation, this seminar will provide the attendee with guidance on developing and continuing a relevant enforcement program. (6 Hours)

B) Principals of Flood Resistant Construction - John Ingaragiola PE CFM FEMA

This all day course will discuss the techniques and best practices developed and enumerated in the recently revised FEMA P-55 Manual in planning, siting, constructing and maintaining residential buildings in coastal areas. (5 Hours)

C) The Energy Code and Existing Building Code

This is a two part course consisting of a two hour presentation on the Existing Building Code which explains each chapter of the code and the three different compliance methods that can be used. This is followed by a 4 hour presentation on the Energy Conservation Construction Code to include what conditions trigger the requirements of the Code and how it applies to new construction, additions, alterations and renovations. (6 hours)

Day Three - Wednesday, April 4, 2012 (Select "A" or "B")

A) Incident Command System Overview for Executives and Senior Officials Christopher Romance, Emergency Response Consulting Group

This course is an ICS orientation for executives, administrators, and policy makers. It provides a basic understanding of ICS, Unified and Area Command, and Multi-agency coordination to those persons responsible for setting or implementing policy. The module also discusses responsibilities and information transfer between agency executives and incident commanders. (6 Hours)

B) Energy Regulations in Version 2 of the IGCC - Vernon Woodworth, AIA, LEED A

A presentation on the requirements and impacts of the Energy provisions of the recently amended International Green Construction Code. (4 Hours)
