ARTHUR BENLINE/PEGGY CORNELL BENLINE 2012 SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

The Eastern States Building Officials Federation Board of Directors is pleased to announce the Arthur Benline-Peggy Cornell Benline Scholarship award, with the assistance and support of Executive Vice-president, Arthur J. Benline, P.E.R.A. Mr. Benline was among the group of building officials who founded E.S.B.O.F. in 1950 and is officially acknowledged as its co-founder. He has endowed the scholarship fund in memory of his beloved wife, Peggy.

The Scholarship fund will provide an award annually, to a son, daughter, or grandchildren of an active E.S.B.O.F. member, for costs for advanced education purposes. The E.S.B.O.F. member must have been in good standing for at least two years, (2010-2011) member), prior to the application for the award.

A Scholarship committee will evaluate and consider the applications. The award will be given to those applicants demonstrating a need for assistance and desiring advanced education. Consideration will be given to current scholastic standing and accomplishments. The committee may award more than one scholarship annually.

HOW TO APPLY FOR THE AWARD

An E.S.B.O.F. active member on behalf of a son, daughter or grandchild may submit a letter requesting an E.S.B.O.F. Scholarship application form. The letter of request should provide the following information:

Applicant's name, home address and telephone number.

Applicant's place of employment and job title.

Student's name and relationship to applicant of E.S.B.O.F. active member.

Applicant's signature and date.
